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## Minute from Ardgay & District Community Council Meeting of – November 09 (draft for approval at December Meeting) In Ardgay Hall at 7.00pm

**1. Welcome** - Tony Gibbs opened the meeting with a welcome to members and visitor, and to new co-opted member David Laver.

**2. Apologies** - were received from Brigitte Geddes and Iain Shand (Nov).

**3. Minutes of the previous meeting** - held on Wednesday 7<sup>TH</sup> October 2009. The Minutes as presented were approved. Proposed by David Hannah and Seconded by Jamie Burgess.

### **4. Matters arising from the minutes;**

- Salt Bins - David Ross reported that a Salt Bin has been filled and installed in Struie Place. A payment from Highland Council towards the costs for tools to grit the pavements will be forthcoming.
- Culrain Garden - Tony Gibbs has spoken with the Chairman and the Secretary of the Culrain Hall Committee and unfortunately, they have not been able to recommend anyone to work on the garden. Cllr. Robbie Rowantree has suggested that we may be able to approach Community Service to consider this project. **Action: Sec**
- Overhanging shrubs and trees on bridge in Ardgay - The Secretary reported on the reply received from John Clark that he would pass this to the Landlords on whose land the trees belong, as he cannot cut back trees etc that overhang from adjoining properties. In addition he mentioned that all road repairs/maintenance etc have ceased due to the current financial situation with the Highland Council.
- Scotrail Train Services - The Secretary has received a reply from Frank Roache asking for a clearer idea of what topics we want him to cover when he comes to speak at a future meeting. The Committee suggested, Train Times, Strategy on Service, Future extensions to existing services, cost of fares, transport links to rail and other transport services, Sunday services, existing services stopping at all stations. **Action Sec.**

### **5. Secretary's Report –**

- Secretary reported on correspondence received from Ardgay Hall Committee inviting the Community Council to have a stall at the Christmas Fayre on November 28<sup>th</sup>. It was felt that due to other commitments on that day we would not be able to take up the invitation this year. **Action: Sec to reply**

- The Scottish Rights of Way and Access Society renewal of subscription (£20) is due – agreed.

- Highland Council Tourism Seminar – Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> November in Council Chamber Inverness.
- Neil Gillies, Highland Council TECS, in reply to our concerns about Traffic speeds in Manse Road Ardgay. Campbell Stewart will make contact.
- Supt. Julian Innes Division Commander North Division, in reply to my letter asking for assistance in the Manse Road matter. Inspector Aitken will contact us about appropriate times and day when they could carry out a speed monitoring exercise.

**6. Treasurer's Report** - Alan Lawrence reported that the three signatories had visited the Bank to formalise the signatures for cheque signings.

## 7. Windfarms;

a) Beinn Tharsuinn Community Benefit Fund - Grant applications have been received from:-

- 1) Bradbury Centre
- 2) Bonar Bridge Football Club
- 3) Gearrhoille Community Wood
- 4) Kyle of Sutherland Heritage Society

Mrs Copley spoke on behalf of the Gearrhoille Community Wood in support of their application. It was suggested that before decisions are made on these applications, it would be beneficial to have further detailed discussion with the applicants to determine more fully the basis for their requests and to gather additional supporting information. It was agreed that Phil Olson and David Hannah will speak to the Bonar Football Club, Tony Gibbs and David Hannah will contact the Bradbury Centre and Phil Olson and Derek Matheson will speak to the Kyle of Sutherland Heritage Centre. Mrs Copley will supply further information on request. The application from the Gearrhoille Community Wood for the sum of £550 to be paid in this year (2009) was agreed. However, the request for the subsequent amounts will be looked at again on receipt of requested further information. Reports from these meetings will be discussed at the next A & DCC meeting in December prior to further consideration of each application. Marion Turner felt that it would be beneficial if the Community Council should have some training or instruction on guidelines to determine criteria for approving applications for grants from the Beinn Tharsuinn Community Benefit Fund. This proposition to be discussed at the next meeting. In the meantime, Tony Gibbs will contact Phil Tomalin for advice on how to arrange this. **Action: TG**

b) Achany Update - Marion Turner and David Hannah reported that the fund is open for the first round of applications and these will be discussed at the next meeting on January 27<sup>th</sup> 2010 in Ardgay Hall, and the results available in February.

- Ardgay Flower Arrangements - Tony Gibbs will speak to Jeannie Sparling to see if she will be willing to look after the Flower Tubs next year. **Action: TG**

Communications** - Newsletter - It was felt that the statement printed in the last newsletter concerning the Lady Ross Hotel Ardgay had been excessive and the Chair will be meeting with the property owner to correct any misunderstandings, and if necessary, a retraction of the last paragraph of the leading article will be printed in the next newsletter. Community Website - Phil Olson said that the website is continuing to be used more often. The public link is proving useful and interesting issues have been raised.

**10. Review of Community Councils** – First Phase - Documents available at this stage have been circulated to members to consider. The Chair said feedback would be welcome for discussion at the next Ward Forum on 28<sup>th</sup> November at Kinlochervervie.

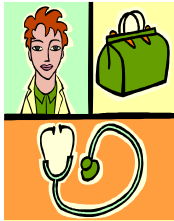
**Exhibition Hailed as a Great Success (Steve Copley)** - The Kyle of Sutherland Heritage Society's, 'Lest We Forget' exhibition, held in October at the former East Church, Ardgay proved to be a very popular event with almost 250 people attending during its 16 day run. The Exhibition consisted of several illustrated information panels, which briefly explained the course of the two World Wars, and how those wars had affected the local area, but the main thrust of the exhibition was to show the public what has been achieved during the first year of the 'Lest We Forget Project'. A ten minute visual presentation featuring some of the fallen for whom details of their brief lives, or war service, are already known, proved very popular and hopefully gave an insight into what the 'Lest We Forget' project hopes to eventually achieve for all 158 of our war dead. On public display, for the first time, were 18 photographs of the area's fallen and during the exhibition 4 other photographs were added to the display. The Project was delighted that 23 pupils from Gledfield School spent a full morning at the exhibition. This has further convinced the project's organisers that if an archive can be collected it will be in good hands as the children were very interested in the exhibition and very insightful in their questioning of the staff and especially Mrs Bunty Gordon who came to speak to them about War time Ardgay. A lot of people put a lot of effort into the exhibition and the project thanks Mrs Bunty Gordon, Mr & Mrs Stobo and especial thanks have to go to Norman MacDonald who stepped into the breach at very short notice and acted as the projects Gaelic spokesman when BBC ALBA TV visited the exhibition and made a short film about the project. This was aired a few days later. The 'Lest We Forget' project also thanks everyone who has already contributed photographs and memories to the archive and we urge anyone else who may have anything to contribute to get in touch as soon as possible because without your photographs and your memories, no matter how fleeting, there will be nothing to pass along to those future generations.

**The Kyle of Sutherland Youth Development Group (KSYDG)** - has been running an after school club and youth group since May on the silver bus located on the south Bonar industrial estate. The group runs four sessions, with the after school club run by a team of volunteers who have been disclosed and trained

in first aid. The youth group is led by the highland council youth services and a number of volunteers. Each week there are art, music and games activities available as well as an outside space for football etc. The youth group has had several exciting activities away from the bus including a trip to Fairbairn activity centre and a full day music workshop with John Sinclair (keyboard player with Ozzy Osbourne). Future plans involve a cinema and shopping trip to Inverness. The project has been donated a modular building which we hope to have up and running by February depending on planning which will house a games room with table tennis and snooker an art area and a music and drama room. Sessions run as follows; P1 - P3 Tuesdays 3.30-4.30, P4-P5 Wednesdays 3.45-4.45, P6-P7 Thursdays 3.45-4.45. Youth group Thursdays 7.30-9.30. Entrance to all sessions is 50p. **Kyle of Sutherland Youth Group** - On the 20<sup>th</sup> September, a group of 12 members from the Kyle of



Sutherland Youth Group, attended Fairburn activity centre at Marybank near Dingwall. They were accompanied by Highland Council employed and volunteer Youth staff. The group (inc the staff) took part in activities including the zip line, tree climb and cross country biking. Tain and District Youth Development officer, Rob Parkes said: "The group were a pleasure to be with during the whole day and enjoyed the facilities at Fairburn very much. Most of the young people (and staff!) were able to push themselves beyond their own expectations, especially with regard to the tree climb and the support coming from the group for each other, helped to make this possible." The group is based in the

youth bus between Bonar Bridge and Ardgay and meet on a Thursday night between 7.30 and 9.30, it has been running since May. Feedback on the group from the Young people who attend is positive and numbers attending are steadily increasing. A Primary aged after-school club also uses the bus most afternoons and has been a huge success with volunteer staff running this. Numbers are now at around 60 per week.

**Kyle of Sutherland Youth Group** - Music project with John Sinclair. On Tuesday the 27<sup>th</sup> October, members of the Kyle of Sutherland Youth Group took part in a music workshop at Bonar Bridge Village hall, their usual venue, the bus, was deemed too small for this event. 8 Young people took the opportunity to work with Highlands based, musician, John Sinclair. Famous acts with whom John, who plays keyboards, has worked with in the past include Suzy Quattro and for 17 years he was on the road with Ozzy Osbourne. John recorded the group playing guitars, violin, singing and added keyboards and percussion. By the end of the day they had recorded, mixed and made CD's of their work, this included covers and song written and performed by one of the group. *(Katie Davies)*



John said: "They're a pleasure to be around, they worked really hard and hopefully have a better idea of what they can achieve down the line" and thanked them and staff at the group for an enjoyable session. Local Youth Development Officer for Highland Council, Rob Parkes said: "The youth group is hoping to build on the day and the considerable talent of its members by continuing to play together and accessing funds for equipment to expand. Thanks, also to the Kyle of Sutherland Youth Development Group who funded this very successful day".

## WALK for WELLBEING (Marion Turner)

The Miller's Burn, 5.5km, 80 minutes. An easy walk which starts and finishes in the village. The timings do not include stops. Wear sensible footwear. At the War Memorial in Ardgay walk up Ardgay Hill. After Cherry Cottage fork down left to where the Alltan na Beiste burn (little burn of the beast) flows under the road on its way to feed the old curling pond in the Gearrhoille Community Wood. Continue uphill, over the cattle grid, to the top where you have beautiful views over the Kyle of Sutherland to Bonar Bridge and Dun Creich. When the tar ends (1.2km, 15mins) at a three way junction, go straight ahead on a track to pass behind Struie Cottage. Stick to the main track walking among the recently thinned pine wood. This is the Badvoon Road. Look out for tits, crossbills and buzzards. The track ends at a gate into a green field (2.1km, 25 mins) and ahead up above the Allt Eiteachan Burn – sometimes called the Miller's Burn - sits the house, Badvoon. You now have a choice, return the way you came or continue on small trails and tracks along the burn, back to the village via Oldtown and the Gearrhoille Community Wood. To continue, go through the gate and head left to pass through another gate and come alongside the burn. Turn left and make your way downstream heading for a metal walking gate which you can see ahead. Look out for dippers, sandpipers and sandmartins. To reach the metal walking gate find some big stones to cross a small stream between you and the gate. Once through the gate (2.4km, 35mins) follow the trail keeping the burn on your right. Choose a way through the wood and where the burn makes a big bend (2.5km) descend to the right to stay alongside the burn till you come to an old weir (3km, 45mins). The weir was built to collect water which was piped to the railway line for the steam trains. More recently, the pipe has taken water to The Hatcheries. At the weir the trail becomes a wider track, follow this through the common grazing till you reach a gate into a field ( 3.3km, 50mins). Go into the field and follow the grassy track passing left of the house to a gate at the NE corner of the field (3.7km, 55mins). Now you are soon back on a tarred road that leads past Oldtown Croft to the main road. At the main road turn left and after about 200m go into the Gearrhoille Community Wood Car Park (4.3km, 60mins). Once in the wood follow the yellow marker posts, past the old curling pond and out along the old drove road to Oakwood Place to return to the War Memorial (5.5km, 80mins).

### Drink in the facts...

A few beers and a couple of large glasses of wine are often the subject of a discussion about health, but did you know that a new Licensing law has come into force this year which is designed to help protect you, and your local community from some of the more negative effects of alcohol?

The Act has taken four years to go through so you may have heard snippets about it along the way but might not have realised that it's now in force.

The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 Act has five clear objectives which it's hoped will:

- Help prevent crime and disorder
- Enhance public safety
- Prevent public nuisance
- Protect and improve public health
- Protect children from harm

The law has been passed to help make Scotland safer as a whole, and to help you as an individual feel safer, and, if you drink alcohol, to encourage you to adopt healthier, more sociable habits.

Now that this law has come into effect you might find that you notice that alcohol is being sold differently. For example in shops and supermarkets it will be sold from designated areas as opposed to dotted around. Happy hours and promotions such as 'buy one get one free' are banned so that there is no more active enticement to drink more than you really intended. Bars must now provide customers with free tap water if requested; it'll make life a lot more economical for any designated driver who will now be able to alternate between water and other non-alcoholic drinks.

In relation to alcohol which is sold for consumption off the premises, this is allowed only between 10am and 10pm. In relation to all other sales, submissions re 'operating hours' will

have been made by all licensees, when applying to Licensing Boards for their particular licences. Approved 'operating hours' will be contained in a summary licence which must be displayed within each premises.

The Licensing Act will also mean some significant changes for bar staff. All employees in licensed premises have to be fully trained before serving alcohol (including part time and casual staff). This means that there should be more knowledge about the law, and more enforcement. The Act makes it easier for people to make their views heard on how alcohol affects their community as a whole; as long as they have reasonable grounds to do so, anyone can ask a Licensing Board to review the licence of any premises.

Highland Council (and indeed every local Council) employs a number of Licensing Standards Officers to investigate any complaints about licensed premises, and to offer general advice to the public on licensing.

Overall, these measures have been put in place to help create a safer and healthier population.
